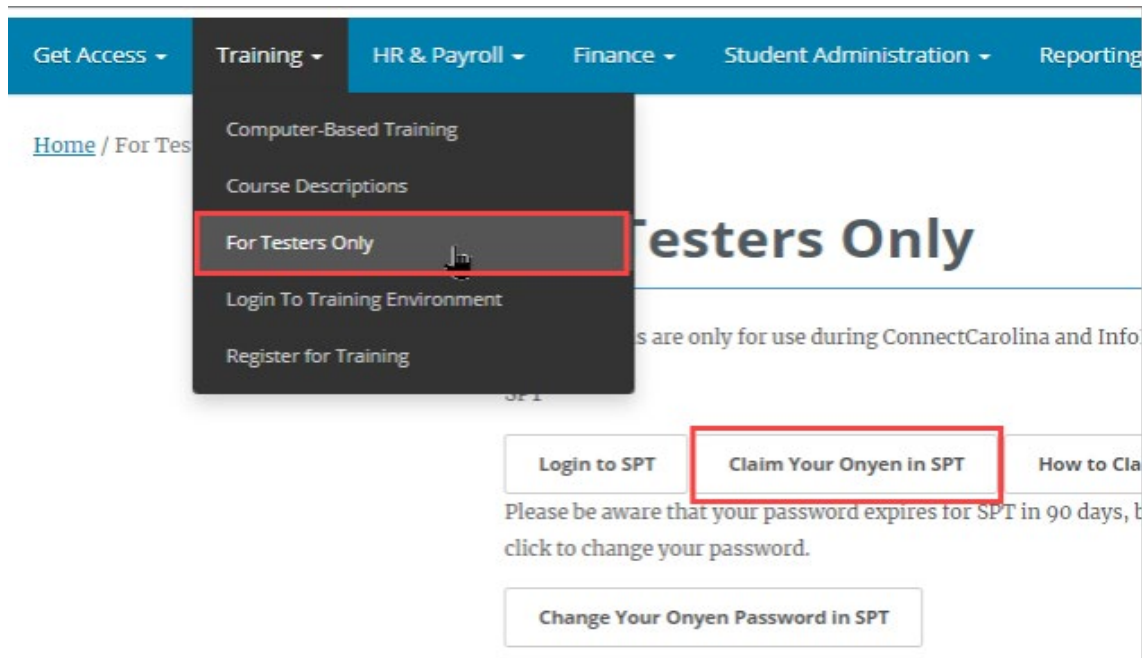


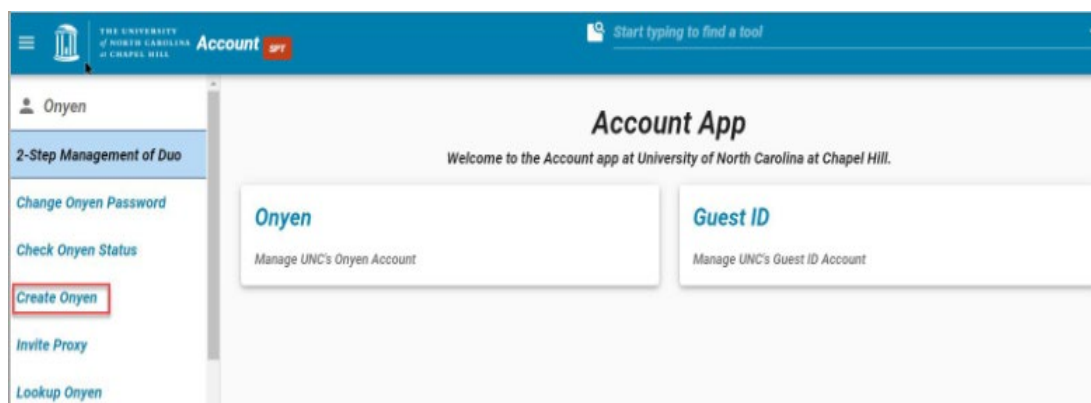
Claiming your Onyen in SPT

If you are logging into ConnectCarolina's non-production environment for testing, you will need to claim your Onyen and create a password specifically for the testing environment. If you are logging in from an off-campus location, you must be connected to the Campus VPN.


1. Go to ccinfo.unc.edu.
2. Click **Training** in the blue menu bar and then click the **For Testers Only** link.
3. Click the **Claim Your Onyen in SPT** tab.



4. On the Account App SPT page, click the **Create Onyen** link.



5. When prompted, click the **Yes, I Agree** button on the Onyen Terms of Agreement page.

Onyen® Terms of Agreement

An Onyen (OnlyNameYou'llEverNeed) is your user name at The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Information Technology Services (ITS) assigns one Onyen and password per person for access to a variety of University services including the University network, network resources, confidential information, and other services ("Access"). The same Onyen and the same password can be used across multiple platforms and services.

You, as a condition of being given Access, acknowledge and agree that you are solely responsible for:

- The consequences resulting from your use of Access. Including, but not limited to, the content of any information you make available to others as a result; and
- Any activity that can be traced back to your Onyen account or computer.

By creating anOnyen, you further agree:


- To use your Access in a manner consistent with all applicable laws and University policies;
- Not to disrupt the University's network or network resources, and to report those who do;
- To protect the security of your Onyen password including not sharing your password with others; and
- That information you electronically store utilizing your Access may be reviewed by University officials consistent with the University's Policy on the Privacy of Electronic Information.

Violation of these terms may result in suspension of your Access and disciplinary action up to and including termination for University employees.

The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill is not responsible for the content of those who have Access and offers its services without warranty, including, but not limited, to an implied warranty of fitness for a particular purpose.



7. On the Create Onyen Services TEST page, enter the following information in the fields:


- PID
- First name
- Last name
- Gender
- Date of Birth

8. Click the **Submit** button.

Create Onyen

An Onyen (Only Name You'll Ever Need) will be your public username and serve as part of your initial email address at UNC. Your Onyen will be visible to many other people at the University, including staff, faculty, and students. Please do not choose a word that you would find embarrassing, or use any part of your password as your Onyen. An Onyen is comprised of three to eight alphanumeric characters. The first character must be an alphabetic letter and it should be in all lowercase.

On the **Create Onyen** page, select the **exact same Onyen** you use in Production. The system may suggest a different Onyen based on your name, but type in the **exact same Onyen** that you use in production. Click **“Use It.”**

11. Continue to follow the instructions on the screen including setup of Alert Carolina, Emergency contact information and challenge-response questions.
12. Finally, you will be asked to set your password. This is the password you will use to log in to the ConnectCarolina SPT environment and it does not impact your production Onyen account or password.

13. On the Account SPT page, click the 2-Step Management of Duo link and follow the instructions on the screen to set up your Non-Production Duo account the first time before you log in.

14. After setting your new password and DUO, return to <https://ccinfo.unc.edu/test-2/>.

15. Click the **Login to SPT** button.
