There will be an outage affecting the Student Administration component of ConnectCarolina on Thurs., June 23, beginning at 5:00pm and ending at approximately 12:00am as part of the Summer II census activities. Census is the official University enrollment reporting date.



Faculty, students and staff will NOT be able to access ConnectCarolina Student Center during this time.

The Finance component is NOT affected by this outage. However, the ePAR hire form for HR/Payroll is impacted, as are some services related to Onyen, PID and Guest ID.

Q: When is an account receivable considered delinquent?

A: An account is generally considered delinquent if it is at least 60+ days in arrears or past due, and no arrangements have been made by the debtor to satisfy the obligation.
