What is RNF?

- RNF = Regular, No FICA
- It is an Earnings Code which is used to prevent FICA from being charged to the employee for that chartfield string

What is an Earnings Code?

- Describes the type of activity
- It is used to determine taxation, distribution, and more
- 95% are REG (regular)
- BLANK = REG
- A searchable list of earning codes can be found in Infoporte in Tools on the Chartfield Lookup tab



Who is eligible?

- Postdoc TRAINEEs who are on a training grant or fellowship which pays as a stipend, with no allowance for FICA
 - Example: T32, F32, some others
- Some Clinical Fellows

Who is not eligible?

- Postdoc Research Associates
- Employees who are here on special Study/Teaching Visas
 They show as STT or TCH
- Pre-doc stipends not paid through ePars, HR/Payroll



How does it work?

• It is designated on the ePar's funding grid

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How and where to enter RNF (continued)

• Expanded Mode

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When CAN'T you enter the RNF earn code

- Clinical Fellows (the Earnings Code field isn't on the ePar)
- If the funding grid will only have one line of funding (100% RNF)

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• Enter it WITHOUT RNF earnings code

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• Submit a Help Desk ticket – requesting addition of RNF



- Manual Intervention
- Human Resources Business Analysts add data to JOB (dollars)
- Commitment Accounting Business Analysts update:
 - DBT (department budget table) percentages
 - DBT tax overrides for FICA
 - Adjust project end date (if needed)
 - PAAT adjustment for tax re-distribution (if needed)
- Payroll gets ticket to process retro FICA adjustment
- Lot of work best to get things correct from the start
- Important: taxation changes cannot cross the calendar year
 - Be sure to make any December changes before the December payroll lockout

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Making the connections

- This was created because there MUST be a REG line (system requirement). You can ignore this.
- If you add a new grid, remove the row (to make the total be the salary amount not doubled)



- Definition of a stipend:
 - A stipend is provided as a subsistence allowance to help defray living expenses during the research training experience. It is not provided as a condition of employment
 - Note: stipends are not considered salaries or wages for work performed, so stipend/RNF expenses are not captured on effort reports. (refer to <u>https://research.unc.edu/sponsored-research/operating-</u> <u>standards/#600.5</u> for more info about effort reporting)
 - NIH K awards (Research Career Development Awards) should be paid as salary (effort) instead of stipend

- Stipend levels are designated by the sponsor, dependent upon years of experience
- Most common are NIH Ruth L. Kirschstein National Research Service Award (NRSA) Stipends
- Trainees on NIH training grants must be appointed via xTrain in eRA Commons
