
How Cost Sharing Works for Salary Projections



 Salary projections are based on the fund, not on the presence of a project ID.

If a project is cost sharing with State funds, the projections are

tied to the State funds.

515120	Social Security	6.20%	Not State AppropriationsNot Grad StudentsNot Post-doc Stipends
515130	Social Security Medicare	1.45%	Not State AppropriationsNot Grad StudentsNot Post-doc Stipends
521110	On-Campus Transit	0.30%	Not Post-doc Stipends
521210	Core Data Fee	0.54%	 Not Post-doc Stipends
516120	Composite Benefit Fund	0.50%	Not State sourcesNot Post-doc Stipends

Note on Social Security: Highly compensated employees will stop projecting once their actual and projected earnings have reached the maximum.
